There has been recent correspondence with Neutrog with regard to ordering and delivery of Neutrog orders to HRiA Perth members.

We are NOT ABLE to collect <u>individual</u> Neutrog orders from their depot (as mentioned at the AGM). It must be delivered <u>in bulk</u> to a home or business.

Our orders are for delivery only <u>once a year in spring.</u> A date to have your order into Neutrog will be decided later in the year.

SO VERY IMPORTANT – Remember when spraying anything in the garden to do so very late in the afternoon (just before dusk) when the bees and other beneficial bugs have departed your garden and 'gone home'.

Heritage Roses in Australia Inc

HRIA was formed in 1979 and is a fellowship of those people whose aims are to advance the preservation, cultivation, distribution and study of old garden roses, roses no longer in general commercial cultivation, roses of historical importance, species roses and their hybrids.

The organization was formed to bring together people who love and collect old roses, the roses of antiquity and the survivors from Australian colonial gardens.
