A Few Hints for Rose Lovers

Choice of Varieties

It is important that you place your order early, as certain varieties will be fully booked, and will not be procurable again this season.

Time of Planting

Roses can be planted from May until the end of September. As soon as you get your plants home, keep them moist and on no account leave them exposed to wind or sunshine. When planting they must be thoroughly washed in to make sure that the roots are in firm contact with the soil.

Soils

Roses grow in all soils if the soil has been prepared. The necessary minerals are essential as well as moisture for the Rose's existence.

Growing Roses in Sand

For best results it is always advisable to enrich beds with loam and animal manure. Prepare bed two to three months before planting. *Never use artificial manures when planting.*

Maintaining the Rose Bed

Your Roses should be kept free of diseases and pests as much as possible. Sucking insect should be checked with nicotine and oil sprays; fungus diseases with Flower of Sulphur or Bordeaux Mixture. *Roses should be pruned every Spring to induce new life—help them along with fertilizers containing equal proportions of Nitrogen, Potash, and Phosphoric Acid. An easy way is to mix two parts of 24 per cent Super, two parts Sulp. Ammonia 24 per cent, one part of Sul. of Potash 48 per cent.*

Bush Roses

- 1 **America HT.**—A beautiful pink rose, a strong grower and almost thornless, an excellent variety for exhibition purposes. Recommended.
- 2 **Amalia Jung**—Brilliant crimson red blooms, with cedar green foliage, has erect vigorous growth, flowers are nicely shaped and full. Richly perfumed.
- 3 **Ambassador**—Sport of Talisman flowers, medium size, and fairly full. Colour salmon pink, strong grower. A good garden rose.
- 4 **Annie Brandt**—Very vigorous with abundant dark green foliage, very long coral red bud, opening to semi-double orange salmon flowers. Flowers freely.
- 5 **Angele Pernet P**—Striking colour orange yellow shaded red, outside petals golden yellow, semi-double. shining foliage.
- 6 **Anni Jebens**—Beautiful full flower, good shape, and carries itself well. Colour deep red inside, while the outside is golden yellow; strong grower, good healthy foliage.
- 7 **Aspirant Marcel Rouyer**—Fairly full, shapely flowers, long buds; colour deep apricot tinted salmon, vigorous growth. A first-class rose.
- 8 **Autumn**—Full flower and strong grower. Colour, a pretty combination of crimson, scarlet, and yellow.
- 9 **August Noack**—Sport of Columbia, but a great improvement on the parent, flowers are bigger and fuller, and bud is more pointed. Colour scarlet red without shadings, keeps colour well, in cool weather becomes fiery blood red.
- 10 **Barcelona H.T.**—A very vigorous grower with erect stems, long pointed bud opening well, the colour is a deep carmine crimson with black velvety shadings, old rose perfume, carries from 40 to 50 petals.
- 11 **Belle Siebrecht**—A good old rose, bright pink, and suitable for exhibition purposes.
- 12 **Betty**—Exceptionally long bud, a very free grower, and is a continuous bloomer, colour coppery overspread with golden yellow.
- 13 **Betty Uprichard H.T.**—Semi-double rose of beautiful colourings, the outer petals are carmine and coppery shadings, while the inner ones are rather a delicate shade of salmon. A very vigorous grower.
- 14 **Bertha Gorst**—Pure crimson cerise with bronze veins, flowers big and lasting when cut. Healthy foliage, good grower.
- 15 **Better Times**—A bright red sport of Briarcliff, has all the fine qualities desired in a good rose.
- 16 **Billy Boiler**—Pillar Rose, colour startling red, a very strong grower, single rose.
- 17 **Bohm's Triumph**—Dark red rose flowers, produced in long stems, grows healthy and strong, free bloomer.
- 18 **Caledonia H.T.**—A perfumed white rose, is well formed and growth and foliage are good. Has about 30 petals.

- 19 **Canary**—Of good size and form, colour light golden yellow; vigorous.
- 20 **Catherine Kordes H.T.**—Long pointed bud opening into splendid shaped flowers, colouring rich scarlet with crimson shadings, a really beautiful variety, worthy of a place in any garden.
- 21 **Catalonia**—Large full beautifully shaped flowers, coloured cardinal light red with yellow at the base of petals, strong growth, exquisite perfume.
- 22 **Carrie Jacobs Bond**—A very strong growing variety, carries the blooms on stems two feet long. Colour bright red, healthy foliage; good.
- 23 **Carmelita**—Striking colour of carmine red, good grower, flowers freely produced.
- 24 **Centifolia Muscosa**—Moss rose, flowers small to medium, colours pink. The best of all moss roses.
- 25 **Cecil Brunner**—Miniature flowers, coloured salmon pink with coppery centre. A very pretty variety.
- 26 **Chas. P. Kilham P.**—Strong erect stems carry a flower of a very brilliant orange red, really attractive rose, carries 30 to 40 petals, recommend.
- 27 **Columbia**—Strong Grower, the blooms are carried erect on stiff stems, colour deep pink (still one of the best pinks). Recommend.
- 28 **Col. R. S. Williamson**—Beautifully shaped cream flowers, strong grower and a continuous bloomer, sometimes up to exhibition form and is a splendid garden variety.
- 29 **Countess of Vandal**—Semi-double flower, bud is long and pointed, the colour is a light shade of buff with inner petals salmon, gold at base.
- 30 **Condesa de Sagato**—A most beautiful variety coloured coppery red inside, golden yellow outside, grows strongly and produces its well formed flowers freely, should have a great appeal to rose lovers. Highly recommended.
- 31 **Crimson Emblem**—A beautiful crimson variety, delightfully perfumed.
- 32 **Crimson Glory**—This is truly the champion of all red roses, brought out by W. Kordes & Son in 1935. Is crossed Catherine Kordes and W. E. Chaplain, coloured carmine red with dark velvety shadings, flowers are full and most perfectly shaped. Is absolutely splendid in blooming habits and far superior to Etoile de Holland.
- 33 **Cristata Sym**—Chap. de Napoleon moss rose, flowers big and full, colour pink, especially well supplied with moss, strong growers.
- 34 **Dame Edith Helen**—A pure pink variety of the highest standard, the blooms are full and with good care this rose makes splendid growth. Can be classed the pink rose. Strongly recommended.
- 35 **Daily Mail Scented H.T.**—A velvet red rose with a rich perfume, growth is fair, flowers semi-double.
- 36 **Druschki Rubra**—Can be described as a red Frau Karl Druschki, robust grower. Colour wine red.
- 37 **Duguesa de Penaranda**—Colour orange, very big flower, lovely scent, a good grower with good healthy foliage.

- 39 **Editor McFarland H.T.**—A very fine full pink flower, free flowering of good shape, perfume is a faint tea. Recommended.
- 40 **Edward Schill**—Strong growing and free blooming, shiny disease resistant foliage, colours coppery red.
- 41 **Effekt**—(Seedling X. J. Zingari.) A very free blooming fancy coloured rose of outstanding beauty. Outside petals are gold orange yellow with red stripes, and when full outside gold yellow, inside carmine red. Growth good.
- 42 **E. G. Hill H.T.**—Superior to all other red roses, the colours being a brilliant scarlet deepening to a richer red as the flower opens, growth is vigorous and it is altogether of good habits, the scent is good. It is an ideal variety for cutting. Recommended.
- 43 **Eileen Dorothea**—A strong grower. Color is rich Carmine
- 44 **Elli Knab**—Enormous full flowers which always opens well. The blooms are carried on long stems, attractive colourings inside petals, pale pink outside strong pink This is easily the most attractive, double coloured rose very strong growth and free flowering habit
- 45 **Elizabeth of York**—Rich cerise pink, good garden or exhibition rose, healthy foliage, vigorous grower.
- 46 **Etoile de Holland**—A richly perfumed dark red rose, growth is good and is a very free bloomer. Unlike most red roses this variety seldom shows a tendency to blue.
- 47 **Everest H.T.**—Gold medal white rose, an exhibition variety of perfect form, the blooms are carried erect on powerful stems, growth is very vigorous, can justly be described as the giant of the garden.
- 47a **Eulalia**—Flowers big and full, good lasting colour of pink, good growers.
- 48 **Erik Hjelm**—Good grower, free bloomer, flowers enormous size. Colour, rosy pink.
- 48a **Feu Joseph Looyman**—Colour yellow and vivid apricot, semi-double blooms of good form. Hardy grower.
- 49 **Feu Pernet Ducher**—A very large yellow rose, which at its best shows carmine on outer petals. Very attractive. Growth good, free flowering.
- 50 **Fluffy Ruffels**—Beautiful clear soft satiny pink blooms, carried on good stems. Growth is very robust. A prolific bloomer very suitable for cutting.
- 51 **Fontanelle H.T.**—This is a large lemon yellow rose, the blooms are beautifully shaped and are produced freely.
- 52 **Frank W. Dunlop H.T.**—Large full pink roses, fairly free bloomer and the growth is strong, a good exhibition variety.
- 53 **Frederico Casas P.**—A very beautiful variety coloured red and yellow, buds are large and long, dark green foliage, growth vigorous, fruit scent.
- 54 **Friberg II.**—Beautifully formed blooms, coloured a silvery pink with deeper shadings on reverse of petals, long buds, produced singly, hardy growth, tea perfumed.

- 55 **Frau Karl Druschki H.T.**—Pure white blooms of splendid shape, exceptionally vigorous growth, the flowers are full and they are produced freely. Scentless.
- 56 **Frieda Krause**—Flowers well formed and full. Colour fiery brilliant red, growth healthy and good, very free blooming.
- 57 **Fritz Hoger**—Flowers big to very big, full, does not burn or blue. Colour dark red without shadings, strong grower, disease proof foliage, one of the most attractive red roses on the market.
- 58 **Gaiety**—The bud is a brilliant shade of orange vermillion, and as the flower opens the petal, which are ruffled, reveal soft shadings of rose, pink and fawn colourings. The foliage of this rose is particularly lovely and most ornamental.
- 59 **Gartendirektor Nose**—A splendid shaped dark crimson. The flowers are double and freely produced on long stems. The growth medium and it is a welcome addition to the reds.
- 60 **General Gallieni**—Blooms are large and fairly full, and its growth is very strong and spreading. Colour is crimson pink shading, red centre, rosy flush.
- 61 **Geheimrat Duisberg**—A beautiful yellow variety, seedling from Rapture X Julien Potin. Grows like Ophelia, but has glistening foliage of good shape and substance.
- 62 **George Dickson**—A beautiful red variety, unfortunately only blooms in the spring, and is consequently not much in demand.
- 63 **George Nabonnand**—A prolific bloomer, has beautiful semi-double creamy pink blooms, buds are faintly tipped with carmine red, ideal for decorative work.
- 64 **Gipsy Lass**—A rich scarlet crimson flower, very full and delightfully perfumed, said to be one of the largest red roses introduced. A strong grower.
- 65 **Golden Ophelia H.T.**—This is an ideal garden rose, the flowers are golden yellow, shading lighter at the edges. Unfortunately this variety fades almost to white in the hot weather, nevertheless it is quite worthy of its place in any garden as it is a profuse bloomer and a good grower. Tea scent.
- 66 **Golden Dawn**—A rose of the highest order, the colour is a lemon-yellow flushed heavily with deep old rose. The blooms are quite full and of splendid shape, the growth is vigorous. A good variety for garden and exhibition. Rich tea scent. Recommended.
- 67 **Goldene Grussan Aachen**—(Polyantha Hybride, Madame Butterfly X Gloria Mundi.) For this type flowers are enormous size and full. Colours golden yellow, with orange red shadings. Ideal for borders.
- 68 **Golden Gleam**—A splendid rose, semi-double blooms, coloured a rich golden yellow, a constant bloomer and a strong grower.
- 69 **Golden Emblem**—Another excellent yellow. Habits and growth of this variety are good, the stems are strong, and the buds are a reddish gold. A pretty free bloomer. Fruit scent.

- 70 **Goldenes Mainz**—Large golden yellow red striped buds opening to golden yellow double blooms. Flowers carried on strong stems, a profuse bloomer, and strong upright grower.
- 71 **Gorgeous**—A beautifully shaped extra large flower, coloured orange-yellow with reddish coppery shadings. A good exhibition rose.
- 72 **Grenadier**—This plant possesses good growth and carries its blooms well on strong stiff stems. It is fairly full and colour is currant red.
- 73 **Gruppenkonigin**—(Polyantha Hybride, Gruss an Aachen X Madame E. Herriot.) Very free blooming flowers for this type, very large and full. Colour carmine pink, inside bright pink.
- 74 **Gustav Grunerwald**—Huge bright pink flowers of splendid substance. This rose makes a good exhibition bloom and has a delightful perfume.
- 75 **Genius Mendel**—Fiery red flowers, well shaped, strong growing and free blooming.
- 76 **Guiseppe Motta** (E. Heizmann, 1935.) Colour of this rose is just like Countess of Vandal, the only difference that I can see, its growth is much stronger with me.
- 77 **Hadley**—A constant favourite with rose lovers. Has rich crimson blooms with full petalage. It is free flowering and practically always in bloom. Growth is vigorous and it is delightfully perfumed.
- 78 **Heinrich Wendland**—This rose will be popular on account of its rich beautiful colourings. It has large full blooms, the buds are long and pointed, and the foliage is another good feature, being very beautiful and shiny. Deep golden yellow on the outside with rich nasturtium red on the inner face of the petals in some measure describes the colourings of this rose, but it must actually be seen to be appreciated.
- 79 **Heros**—Colour dark velvety red, flowers are large and full, good scent (stock limited).
- 80 **His Majesty**—Large full dark rich crimson blooms, has tremendously long stems. Growth is very vigorous. Beautiful scent.
- 81 **Herrman Eggers**—Very free blooming red rose of good substance. A vigorous grower.
- 82 **Heinrich Eggers**—Exhibition rose. Colour, orange salmon, full and well formed.
- 83 **Hoosier Beauty**—Large well formed blooms carried on long stiff stems, the colour glowing crimson with dark shadings. A very strong grower with mildew proof foliage. Sweet perfume.
- 84 **Hugo Roller**—Medium sized good shaped flowers, colour is creamy-yellow petals, edged and suffused with crimson, very similar in appearance to Penelope, but is a much better grower and altogether a more superior bloomer.
- 85 **Impress**—A fairly new variety and a very beautiful one. The colour is coppery salmon pink, could be described as a full Shot Silk. Growth is strong and it has beautiful shiny foliage.

- 86 **Imperial Potentate**—A splendid shaped rose with long buds opening to large full flowers. Colour is glistening rose pink with silvery suffusion at the base of the petals. Sweet perfume.
- 87 **Jan Abbing**—Well formed buds opening to perfect shaped full flowers coloured brilliant red with yellow variations. Continuous bloomings and vigorous. Good garden rose
- 88 **J. K. B. Roos**—A recent introduction. A very good shaped rose, coloured pale pink. A sport of Columbia.
- 89 **Jonkeer J. L. Mock**—Huge blooms carried on straight stiff stems. Silvery pink on the inside of the petals and deep pink outside are the colours. This variety does not branch well but makes very upright growth. An old rose but still a general favourite. Good for exhibition purposes.
- 90 **Julien Potin**—A magnificent rose, coloured a delightful golden yellow. The flowers are large and full and of perfect shape. Glossy foliage and growth fairly strong. Good for exhibition.
- 91 **K. A. Victoria**—Another very old variety which still holds its own with rose lovers, and justly so, for it is an excellent garden and exhibition rose. Flowers are full and always of good shape. The colour is creamy with the centre slightly tinged with yellow. A very vigorous grower.
- 92 **Korovo**—Peach coloured rose of good merits. Strong grower, a good garden rose.
- 93 **Kurt Scholtz**—Flowers are very big and full, carried on long stems, lasting well when cut. Colour scarlet with well formed blooms which neither burn nor blue.
- 94 **La France**—An old rose with a delightful scent. Good grower and free flowering. Colour, pale rose.
- 95 **Lord Lonsdale**—Big full flowers, perfectly shaped. A very free bloomer. Growth, bushy; colour, narcissus yellow.
- 96 **Lady Hillingdon**—A deep apricot yellow rose. The blooms are produced on long wiry stems, but unless very well grown is inclined to hang its blooms. Growth is fairly strong. A very decorative variety.
- 97 **Lady Roberts**—A strong bushy grower, very pretty medium sized flowers, colourings are apricot with copper red at base. Prolific bloomer.
- 98 **Lady Greenall**—Semi-double variety, strong growth and free flowering. Cream colour with orange at the base.
- 99 **Lady Margaret Stewart**—Variable colours are features of this very pretty rose. The petals are carmine with crimson veins on the outside, while inside petals are a deep apricot shade. Flowers are full, while growth is all that could be desired.
- 100 **Lady Helen Maglona**—Growing vigorously and blooming freely, this variety carries sweetly perfumed, bright crimson flowers with blackish markings on strong erect stems. Blooms full and good size.

- 101 **Lady Elizabeth Barnes**—Vigorous growing medium sized blooms, coloured silvery inside of petals, deep pink on the reverse. Free flowering.
- 102 **Lady Ashton**—A good garden and exhibition rose, has large pale pink double blooms. A good doer.
- 103 **Laurent Carle**—Large full flowers of perfect form, colours velvety carmine, free flowering and vigorous growth, delightfully fragrant.
- 104 **Little Beauty**—Good shaped light crimson blooms carried erect on strong stems, is a very hardy grower. A pretty variety.
- 105 **Lord Rossmore**—A perfectly shaped rose of immense size, grows very strongly and flowers freely. Colour cream white tipped with rose at edge of petals. Good exhibition variety.
- 106 **Lord Charlemont**—A very fine deep crimson rose, with long buds opening to large full flowers. Growth is vigorous and it is a very constant bloomer. Sweet scent.
- 107 **Lorraine Lee**—Semi-double bright pink rose, is a very free flowering variety, and has disease resistant foliage, very beautiful in spring and autumn, and splendid in winter.
- 108 **Lidya Barowa**—Said to be an improvement on Mademe Butterfly,
- 109 **Los Angeles**—Beautifully shaped flowers, richly coloured flame, pink and coral with gold shadings at the base. The buds which are long and pointed, expand into large fragrant flowers. This is a constant favourite.
- 110 **Louise Kath Breslau**—A very large free flowering variety, colouring very similar to that of Shot Silk. Quite full and vigorous.
- 111 **Luis Brinas (P. Dot)**—A vigorous upright grower, with clean, healthy foliage. Colour orange copper, pointed bud; good.
- 112 **Luna**—Long yellow buds well formed and opening to large pale yellow flowers carried well on erect stem. Good growth, tea perfume.
- 113 **Madame Butterfly**—No garden should be without this splendid rose, a sport of Ophelia, but freer flowering than the parent. Colours, a harmony of pink, apricot and gold. Very fragrant.
- 114 **Madame Jules Bouche**—A vigorous growing white flower, faintly shaded with rose in the centre. Very well formed with fine long shaped buds.
- 115 **Madame P. S. Du Pont**—Long deep yellow flowers carried erect, splendid variety; very vigorous and very free flowering
- 116 **Madame Edward Herriot**—Beautiful glossy foliage and a charming tangerine colour are the chief features of this variety. Very popular.
- 117 **Madame Jules Grolez**—Splendidly formed, large and full blooms. Colour Chinese pink. A very good variety.
- 118 **Madame Segond Weber**—A rosy salmon double rose. The blooms are enormous and perfectly shaped. Vigorous grower.
- 119 **Madame Abel Chatenay**—A very good garden type which is always in bloom. Colours, rosy carmine, shaded salmon, flowers double, growth strong.

- 120 **Malar Ros**—A New Rose which should prove popular, has long pointed buds opening to perfect shaped deep crimson flowers, carries fifty petals and is sweetly scented. Suitable for exhibition purposes.
- 121 **Mary Hart**—Buds are maroon red opening to beautifully formed fragrant blooms of velvety red. Growth is strong and it is a profuse bloomer. Another sport of Talisman.
- 122 **Marianne**—Extremely pretty rose, coloured a mixture of coppery orange pink and red. Grows vigorously and produces flowers freely.
- 123 **Margaret McGredy**—A good garden and exhibition rose. Flowers are large and full and beautifully formed. Colours, orange scarlet, very bright; strong growers. Recommended
- 124 **Marie Adelaide**—A nice full rose, coloured apricot yellow. This is a vigorous grower.
- 125 **Madam Forest Colcombet**—Flowers are borne on long stems. Colour, shiny dark carmine with scarlet red blending. One of the best reds for cutting.
- 126 **Madam Joseph Perraud**—Long slender buds, opening to large, full flowers. Buds, orange, changing when full to buff with shell pink shadings.
- 127 **May Krause**—Reddish orange colour in early stages, changing as flower opens, to pure yellow. Free blooming and a good grower.
- 128 **Madam Albert Gillies**—Strong upright grower, flower oval in shape, large semi-double. Colour, carrot. Free bloomer.
- 129 **Mevrouw G. A. Van Rossem**—Worthy of a place in any garden on account of its rich and beautiful colourings, heavily flamed and shaded dark orange and apricot on yellow ground, flowers are large and growth vigorous glossy foliage.
- 130 **Midnight Sun**—A dark crimson rose with black velvety shadings. Very vigorous and good decorative variety.
- 131 **Miss Australia**—Could be described as a pale Dame Edith Helen, large full flowers carried erect on strong stems. A very fine variety.
- 132 **McGredy's Scarlet**—A fine scarlet rose with long pointed buds which open to very attractive flowers. Growth is very good with a tea scent.
- 133 **McGredy's Triumph**—Very large full flowers, coloured geranium red, flushed orange, deepening to rich orange at base. Free flowering habits and has healthy vigorous growth.
- 134 **McGredy's Yellow**—Flowers in bud stage are yellow, opening to large well formed blooms of lemon yellow. Strong grower.
- 135 **McGredy's Ivory**—A creamy white coloured rose. Freely produced. blooms. Strong grower.
- 136 **Mrs. A. R. Waddell**—Semi-double variety. Colours, apricot to orange and opening to a reddish salmon. Good decorative type and a vigorous grower.
- 137 **Mrs. Sam McGredy**—Striking coloured flowers, coppery apricot, and on the outside a light reddish shade. Buds are beautifully shaped long and pointed. Foliage glossy and a strong grower.

- 138 **Mrs. W. E. Lennon**—Very large semi-double flowers with long buds. Colour a reddish carmine. A good grower and a constant bloomer. Sometimes up to exhibition form. Very fragrant.
- 139 **Mrs. J. D. Eisele**—This plant is a good grower with free blooming habits. Colour, rich cherry red. Flowers are large and well shaped. Very fragrant; a champion.
- 140 **Mrs. Lovel Swisher**—Very attractive good shaped blooms, petals on the outside are lilac rose, shading to deep yellow at centre. Growth and flowering are good. Tea scent.
- 141 **Mrs. H. R. Darlington**—A splendid creamy white double rose. Flowers freely and grows vigorously. A good garden and exhibition variety. Tea fragrance.
- 142 **Mrs. Henry Winnett**—A very dark crimson rose. The buds are long and pointed, opening to beautiful double flowers. Splendid grower and free bloomer. Shows little tendency to blue. Sweet scent.
- 143 **Mrs. Herbert Hoover**—Upright growing red rose. Good shape and freely produced blooms. A strong grower.
- 144 **Mrs. George Shawyer**—Extra vigorous growth and free flowering. Large double pink roses, is more or less inclined to suffer from mildew, but the good quality of this variety should carry it over this fault. Tea fragrance.
- 145 **Mrs. Charles Lamplough**—Immense sweetly scented creamy white blooms, growing strongly and carried very erect on long stems. ideal for exhibition purposes.
- 146 **Mrs. Chas. Bell**—A sport of Radiance and has all the good qualities of the parent as regard growth and habits. The colour is a delicate shade of shell pink. Very sweet scent.
- 147 **Mrs. H. Queenell**—A very pretty variety, has good shaped flowers, fairly full. Colour in the bud is carmine, when open shell pink. Moderate growth, free flowering.
- 148 **Mrs. Dunlop Best**—One of the best garden types, fine long buds opening to good sized shapely blooms. Colour, a rich apricot, coppery yellow at base. Extra vigorous growing and flowering. A sweet scent.
