We guarantee all our Roses are budded on true *Fortuniana Stock* and include all the best and latest varieties. These include the best novelties imported this year from the British Isles and the Continent.

ROSE PLANTING

The time for this is May to the end of August. Six to eight inches is deep enough. In the case of Dwarf Roses, the union (that is, where the plant is budded) should not be buried below the soil. This is more important in a heavy soil. Each root should be carefully laid out—not allowed to cross each other. Cover the roots with soil. Tread the soil firmly on roots. Water each plant with one gallon of water. Do not allow manure near the roots when planting.

Outstanding Novelties for 1949

ANDREE PALTHEY, H. T. (Gaujard)—Has an unusually luminous red colour which does not fade. Beautifully shaped, perfumed, healthy and vigorous. 10/6 each.

GENERAL GUISSAN (Heizman)—A seedling from Crimson Glory and E. G. Hill. Colour velvety dark red, very large with strong tea-rose perfume. A beautiful rose strongly recommended for a sunny position. Somewhat brighter in colour in the summer but never miscoloured. Plants unsusceptible to disease. 10/6 each.

GLORY OF FRANCE, H.T. (Gaujard)—Fairly full, large flower. The colour is orange red with a tint of copper. Blooms very profusely and was awarded the 1945 Gold Medal at Bagatelle as the best novelty of the year. 10/6 each.

GRETEL GREUL, H.T.—This novelty was produced during the War. Its colour is salmon and it will prove popular. 10/6 each.

HENRIETTA PETCHTOLD (Spek)—This is a most beautiful rose in a shade of red difficult to describe. It is full and shapely and should be a good rose for decorative purposes. 10/6 each.

LA VAUDOISE, H.T. (Heizman)—This is a splendid dark, blood red colour with long, elegant buds which develop into large, full and perfect flowers, appearing singly on straight stems. The plant grows strong and erect and the foliage is abundant and healthy. The rose preserves its colour unchanged even at the height of summer and does not fade in the hottest sunshine. 10/6 each.

MARGOT ANSTISS (Norman)—Rich, glossy satin pink flowers, with, in the autumn, gold shading at the base of the petals. The flowers are very large and have a delicate tea perfume. A free-flowering variety with vigorous and branching habits, specially recommended for show purposes. 10/6 each.

MARIE-ROSE TOUSSAINT, H.T. (Gaujard)—Very large and full, pleasantly perfumed and blooms profusely. The colour is a vivid satiny pink. 10/6 each.

MICHELE MEILLAND (Meilland)—Perfect in shape, the high pointed centre is gradually revealed as the petals reflex in exquisite formation, firm, precise and slightly frilled. For bedding, cutting, decoration, exhibition, this is the rose. In the bud, soft, deep, glowing coral, the reverse of the petals silvery rose with a hint of lilac shading. As the flower opens the colour blends and shades to a delicate pink. The habit of the plant is clean and vigorous—flowers held firmly erect and the foliage plentiful and darkest green. 10/6 each.

PROVENCE, H.T. (Meilland)—This attractive variety has long pointed buds which reflex to perfection as the blooms open. The thick petals are a dark buff colour shading to gold. The growth of the plant is strong and upright and the dark green foliage resistant to disease. 10/6 each.

RED ENSIGN (Norman)—From the same seed pod that produced Ena Harkness. Suitable for both garden and exhibition purposes and is a really strong grower. The flowers are a glowing red crimson, very large, shapely and richly scented with Old Damask fragrance. 10/6 each.

Outstanding Novelties (Continued)

ROSE OF LYONS (Gaujard)—A large flower isolated on its stem. The buds are elongated, of an orange lemon colour and of perfect shape. At full bloom the flowers unfold harmoniously and retain for several days an ideal form. The bush is very vigorous with tall stems and beautiful foliage. Awarded Gold Medal at the National Exhibition at Bagatelle. 10/6 each.

SPEK'S YELLOW (Spek)—A deep and brilliant yellow. A really good colour. The habit is upright and the flowers are well shaped. The foliage is dark glossy green and resistant to disease. 10/6 each.

CHARLES GREGORY, H.T. (Gregory)—The colour might be described as scarlet flushed gold, but it is predominantly scarlet. The blooms are very shapely and for decorative work or any form of decoration they will be found ideal.

DOMINA, H.T. (Heizman)—A new indescribable colour, orient red with orange. Large, well filled flowers appearing in rather large numbers. Healthy olive green foliage. Exceptionally strong grower with very free flowering.

ENA HARKNESS, H.T. (Norman)—An offspring of Crimson Glory and Southport, combining the best qualities of both varieties, unique among red roses as a variety that does not fade, the colour lasts until the petals drop. The rich crimson-scarlet beautifully formed, scented flowers are very freely produced on strong stems throughout the season. Highly recommended.

LAUSANNE, H.T. (Heizman)—Sport of Heinrich Wendland with the growth of Ville de Saverne. Colour outside apricot, inside orange and vivid salmon red. Very large flowers, full and sweetly scented. Blooms frequently.

MIRANDY, H.T. (Lammerts)—A glorious rich, highly fragrant dark crimson of exhibition size and shape. It carries 50 or more large petals and is capable of championship blooms under favourable conditions.

PEACE, H.T. (Meilland)—The buds are rather short, opening to a large double bloom of rich yellow with each petal edged rose pink. At all times a very beautiful and attractive variety, with dark, glossy foliage resistant to disease. Highly recommended.

TASSIN, H.T. (Meilland)—Velvety dark red, with pleasant perfume. The bud is almost black. Tassin will supersede all other black red roses as it grows vigorously and blooms frequently. Highly recommended.

COLETTE JELOT, Hyb. Poly. (Meilland)—Has two colours, yellow and a touch of vivid pink on the inner side of the petals. Large magnificently formed flowers in large corymbs.

CRIMSON POLLY, Poly. (Howard & Smith)—Formal cupped rosettes of deep crimson, semi-double flowers which retain their colour very well. The growth is moderate and branching, and suitable for borders and low hedges.

EUTIN, Hyb. Poly. (Kordes)—Semi-double flowers of rich carmine red borne in large clusters on strong stems. The colour intensifies after opening.

FRENESHAM, Hyb. Poly. (Norman)—An excellent hardy deep crimson with beautiful foliage, which is not subject to mildew. The flowers hold their rich colour until the last, are double and well formed and do not produce seed pods.

Novelties (Continued)

MING TOY, Hyb. Poly. (Krebs)—Small, long buds opening to very double blooms in clusters. The colour is rose pink which fades to a lighter pink.

MINNA KORDES, Hyb. Poly. (Kordes)—A rather low growing variety with large 3-inch semi-double fragrant blooms of rich, deep crimson colour. These are borne in clusters and are a very pleasant colour.

PINOCCHIO, Hyb. Poly. (Kordes)—The small to medium semi-double, pinkish apricot blooms are up to 3in. across, produced in sprays of up to 20 flowers. The growth is clean and healthy and moderately tall.

CLIMBING MRS. SAM MCGREDY, H.T. (Wilson)—This vigorous climbing sport is sure of immediate attention. The blooms are very variable, ranging round coppery orange with rich bronzy foliage.

CLIMBING MARY HART, H.T. (Senter)—A vigorous climbing sport. The colour is described as crimson scarlet, flushed orange and fading to a deep carmine.

CLIMBING PICTURE, H.T. (Swim)—Perfectly formed pink blooms of an attractive colour. This climbing sport will be as welcome as the bush.

ALICE HARDING—Double deep yellow, shapely blooms. The growth and foliage are good.

AMERICA—Buds long and pointed, a beautiful pink rose, strong grower, fragrant. Recommended.

ANGELE PERNET—Shiny bronze green foliage. Colour: orange yellow, shaded red, outside petals golden yellow.

ANNA NEAGLE—Blooms are of medium size, full, of bright currant red of exceptional brilliance. Free and branching habit and dark green foliage.

ANNI JEBENS—Hardy and vigorous, bronze green foliage. Colour: a most striking combination of yellow, orange, scarlet and carmine. Fruit scent.

AUTUMN—Coppery red, shaded orange. Good perfume.

ANGELS MATEAU—Colour: magnificent coppery salmon. Flowers large and full, carried on erect stems.

APRICOT QUEEN—Colour apricot with a yellow base. Growth upright. Very free flowering.

AUREOLA—Pure golden yellow. Flowers full, growth vigorous.

BARCELONA—Flowers large and lasting. Colour: outside of petals crimson red, inside of petals velvety dark red. Strongly scented. Recommended.

BELLE SIEBRECHT—Bright pink; flowers beautifully formed; a great favourite for exhibition.

BETTER TIMES—A bright red sport of Briarcliff, has all the fine qualities desired in a good rose. Recommended.

BRASIER—Vigorous and profuse flowering, dark green disease resisting foliage, long bud of red with dark flames.

BRIARCLIFF—A sport from Columbia, but flowering more often than the older variety. Brilliant pink colour with sweet rich fragrance. Recommended.

CALEDONIA—Splendidly formed pure white, backed up with good growth and foliage. Blooms richly perfumed. Recommended.

CAPT. F. S. HARVEY CANT—Salmon pink, suffused with yellow. Flowers large, fairly full. Faint fruit scent. Good exhibition rose.

CARITO MacMAHON—Flowers deep sunflower yellow turning to gold in the autumn. Flowers carried on long, rigid stems, almost thornless.

CATALONIA—Large, full blooms of cardinal red with yellow base. Recommended.

CATHERINE KORDES—Rich scarlet with crimson shades. Buds long and pointed. Good growth. Highly recommended.

CHARLES P. KILHAM—Fine large shape. Bold petals. Colour: brilliant orange orient red suffused with glowing scarlet.

XX CHRISTOPHER STONE—Bright velvety scarlet. Petals are large, wide, and of great substance. Foliage is a rich green. Growth vigorous. Strong perfume. Recommended.

XX COLUMBIA—A delightful shade of rose pink deepening as the flower ages. A rich sweet perfume. Recommended.

COMTESSE VANDAL—Coppery salmon. Semi-double flowers of particularly high quality. Recommended.

CONDESA DE SASTAGO—Colour: a striking coppery red inside with golden yellow outside. Tea scent. Recommended.

X CRIMSON GLORY—Colour: vivid deep crimson with soft velvety nap. Vigorous growth and richly scented. An outstanding variety. Very highly recommended.

CYNTHIA—Flowers large, full and lasting. Colour: orange red remaining unaltered during flowering. Growth vigorous.

DAILY MAIL SCENTED—Rich deep velvety red with a scarlet sheen. Richly scented.

XX DAME EDITH HELEN—Pure glowing rose pink without shading. Flowers large and with the true rose scent. Highly recommended.

DR. F. G. CHANDLER—The buds are long and pointed, carried on strong, erect stems. The colour is bright crimson scarlet of an even shade. Growth and habit excellent. Old rose fragrance.

DUQUESSA DE PENERANDA—Colour: orange passing into salmon. Flowers large and deliciously scented. Highly recommended.

EDITOR McFARLAND—Large, double flowers of deep pink. Faint tea scent. Very vigorous. Recommended.

E. G. HILL—Dazzling scarlet deepening to a richer red as the blooms develop. Vigorous growth. Damask scent. Highly recommended.

ELIZABETH ARDEN—White. Good shape, sweet scent.

ELITE—Flowers full and carried on long, rigid stems. Colour: orange pink. Recommended.

- ETERNAL YOUTH**—Extra large double flowers of light pink heavily suffused orange salmon. The colour is unusually lasting; the blooms are carried on long, strong stems with abundant foliage.
- ETHEL SOMERSET**—Shrimp pink. Flowers large and perfectly finished. Growth vigorous. Delightful fragrance. Recommended.
- ETOILE DE HOLLANDE**—Dark red buds opening to bright red. Sweetly scented.
- EULALIA**—Flowers very large, full and extraordinary long lasting. Colour: strong pink with yellow reflections. Recommended.
- EVERT VAN DYK**—Large, full, clear carmine pink flowers. Apparently a seedling of Columbia and a healthy, vigorous, productive variety.
- FACKEL**—A well-formed pointed bud, opening to a very double flower of non-burning crimson red, shaded blackish, with a slight fragrance. Vigorous, compact and upright growth and a profuse bloomer.
- FASCINATION**—Rosy cerise shaded yellow. Strong fruit scent.
- FEU PERNET DUCHER**—Deep yellow blooms, large and splendidly shaped. Growth vigorous. Recommended.
- FRAU KARL DRUSCHKI**—Pure white double blooms of a splendid shape.
- FRITZ HOGER**—Flowers large and very full, carried on long rigid stems. Colour: pure dark red with shading. Highly recommended.
- GAIETY**—A rose of many colour variations in which coppery red and pink appear mixed in varying proportions. Recommended.
- GEHEIMRAT DUISBERG**—Yellow flowers of good size, shape and substance. Highly recommended.
- GIPSY LASS**—Rich scarlet, double flowers. Sweetly scented.
- GIRONA**—A glorious medley of rose-pink, yellow and red, somewhat recalling Talisman in colour.
- GOLDEN DAWN**—Rich sunflower yellow heavily flushed with deep old rose. Growth vigorous. Highly recommended.
- GOLDEN GLEAM**—Probably the richest yellow we have in roses. Fruit scent.
- GOLDEN OPHELIA**—Flowers golden yellow shading, lighter at the edges. Tea scent; recommended.
- GRANAT**—The unopened buds are black and open to shapely, medium-sized blooms of velvety-crimson. The foliage is healthy, while growth is very vigorous. Richly fragrant.
- GRAND DUCHESS CHARLOTTE**—The outer petals are reddish brown, showing a bright tomato interior. The size and shape are good. Vigorous bushy growth and large, glossy green leaves, resistant to all diseases.
- GUISEPPE MOTTA**—Inside of petals flesh pink to satin pink, exterior red yellow. Strong scent. Same type as Comtesse Vandal but a better grower.
- HADLEY**—Rich crimson blooms. Very fragrant; recommended.

- HECTOR DEANE**—Shapely blooms of lustrous cerise pink. Growth vigorous with attractive large foliage. Richly fragrant. Highly recommended.
- HEINRICH WENDLAND**—Deep golden yellow on the outside with rich nasturtium red on the inner face of petal; highly recommended.
- HEINRICH GAEDE**—Very showy variety; yellow, shading to rich copper. Growth good.
- HOOSIER BEAUTY**—Glowing crimson with darker shadings. Mildew-proof foliage. Vigorous growth. Sweet scent.
- IMPRESS**—Coppery salmon pink. Growth is strong and it has beautiful shiny foliage.
- IMPERIAL POTENTATE**—Splendidly shaped buds opening into large double flowers of glistening rose pink. Sweetly scented.
- JACQUES LATOUCHE, H.T.**—Buds coppery red, opening to coppery carmine flowers. Old blooms fade to pink, but are a very attractive colour.
- JONKHEER J. L. MOCK**—Silvery pink on inside of petals with a deep pink exterior.
- J. OTTO THILOW**—A rich, glowing rose pink, of exceptional merit, with long, pointed buds of perfect formation. It is a strong grower and a continuous profuse bloomer.
- JULIEN POTIN**—Rich golden yellow that deepens as the flower matures. Sweetly scented.
- JOSEPHINE SPEICKER, H.T.**—An improved Mev. G. A. Van Rossem. Bud and flower globular, very double, lasting, delicate deep orange to yellow. Glossy, dark green foliage.
- KAISERIN AUGUSTE VIKTORIA**—Creamy white with faint yellow tinge at centre. Tea scent.
- KING ALEXANDER I.**—Reddish copper in the bud, opening to golden copper, with most attractive bronze-green foliage.
- KOROVO**—Clear salmon pink. Double. A really good rose; recommended.
- LA FRANCE**—Bright lilac rose. Wonderful perfume.
- LADY HILLINGDON**—Rich yellow flowers with a strong tea perfume.
- LADY HUNTINGFIELD**—This fine, healthy bush rose carries its large golden flowers on good stems, while ample foliage and constant flowering are added virtues.
- LADY MARGARET STEWART**—Yellow veined orange, scarlet.
- LADY TRENT, H.T.**—The colour is of pure coppery orange without shading, a colour that is retained until the petals fall. Growth vigorous with healthy, dark green foliage.
- LADY SYLVIA**—A sport from the well-known Madame Butterfly. It resembles its parent in all respects except colour, which is superior, as all the shades are intensified and are more lively. Sweet scent.
- LEADING LADY**—Ivory white buds opening to soft pink blooms. Sweetly perfumed. Very full.

- LEMANIA**—Red with a blackish sheen. Large full flowers. The growth is vigorous with disease-resisting foliage.
- LLEIDA**—This variety reproduces the beautiful and popular colours of Condesa de Sagato; the growth is of fine vigour and the foliage large and abundant.
- LORD CHARLEMONT**—Crimson deepening to carmine crimson. Sweetly scented. Highly recommended.
- LORD LONSDALE**—Yellow, full flowers, perfectly shaped, free bloomer; growth bushy.
- X **LORRAINE LEE**—Blooms terracotta pink. Rich tea scent; recommended.
- LOS ANGELES**—Luminous flamed pink, toned with coral and shading to gold. Fruit scent.
- LUIS BRINAS**—A fully double, starry, orange coppery flower. When fully open the flower is old rose flushed with gold; recommended.
- MADGE WHIPP**—A big red fragrant rose, glowing crimson and fiery scarlet. Growth vigorous and foliage rich olive green.
- MADAME ABEL CHATENEY**—Bright carmine rose, shaded with pale vermillion rose and salmon. Faint tea scent.
- MADAME BUTTERFLY**—A harmony of bright pink, apricot and gold. Rich perfume and freedom of bloom; recommended.
- MADAME EDOUARD ESTAUNIE**—The flower, which opens well, is large, double, beautifully shaped and sweetly scented, colour nankeen yellow shaded red in centre, flesh colouring on tips and reverse of petals. Vigorous and erect growth.
- MADAME JEAN GAUJARD**—Named after the wife of the raiser. Orange yellow blooms, graceful and perfectly shaped, born singly on strong stems. Considered by M. Gaujard to be one of the best the firm of Pernet-Ducher has ever introduced.
- MADAME JOSEF PERRAUD**—Nasturtium orange changing to nasturtium buff with a shading of shell pink at edge of petals. Sweet fragrance.
- MADAME JULES BOUCHE**—Vigorous and free flowering habit. Colour: white; flowers large, full and perfectly formed.
- MADAME LOUISE LENS**—Perfectly shaped pure white blooms of about forty petals.
- MADAME MAURICE GAZIN**—Blooms reddish crimson with scarlet centre. Growth vigorous.
- X **MADAME PIERRE S. DU PONT**—Flowers large, fairly full and fruit scented; of an intense yellow shaded ochre; highly recommended.
- X **MALAR ROS**—Buds large and pointed and open to glorious blooms of dark red with glistening crimson sheen. Rich perfume; highly recommended.
- MAMAN COCHET**—Beautiful pink.
- MARGARET MCGREY**—Large full flowers of perfect form. Orange pink.
- MARY HART**—A red sport of Talisman. Colour: glistening crimson scarlet flushed orange. Damask perfume.
- MAX KRAUSE**—Deep reddish orange changing to clear yellow as the bloom opens; highly recommended.
- MCGREY'S IVORY**—Creamy yellow fading to a very clear white. Light damask perfume.
- MCGREY'S PEACH**—Buds long and pointed. Colour: yellow suffused apricot.

- MCGREY'S SCARLET**—Bright reddish cerise. Faint tea scent; recommended.
- X **MCGREY'S SUNSET**—A variety which is aptly named. Outside of petals clear buttercup yellow, inside chrome yellow at the base, shading off into bright scarlet. Very vigorous growth and bronze green foliage.
- MCGREY'S TRIUMPH**—Geranium red, heavily flushed orange. Blooms large and of perfect form.
- MCGREY'S YELLOW**—Large, well-formed blooms of a distinct lemon-yellow shade; highly recommended.
- MEV. G. A. VAN ROSEEM**—Large flowers heavily flamed and shaded dark orange and apricot on a dark yellow ground. Good.
- MISS AUSTRALIA**—Delicate shell pink, sweetly scented.
- MRS. BRYCE ALLAN**—Soft, silvery rose of splendid shape with the loveliest of damask perfume.
- MRS. DUNLOP BEST**—Reddish apricot with coppery yellow base. Sweetly scented; recommended.
- MRS. HAROLD BROCKLEBANK**—Creamy white with buff centre. Outer petals sometimes tinted salmon rose. Very strong tea scent; highly recommended.
- MRS. H. WINNETT**—A beautiful double red rose.
- MRS. HERBERT STEVENS**—Buds long and pointed. Colour: white. Faint tea scent.
- X **MRS. SAM MCGREY**—Flower on inside is coppery apricot and on outside a light Lincoln red; recommended.
- MRS. W. E. LENNON**—Large long pointed buds, reddish carmine and very fragrant; highly recommended.
- NIGRETTE**—Intensely velvety black red without shading. Plants bushy and compact. Scented.
- NINON VALLIN**—Outside petals clear yellow, inside coppery-red. Strong disease-resistant foliage.
- NUMA FEY**—Extra large, perfectly formed blooms of salmon orange, shading to rosy salmon with paler edges. The growth is vigorous and particularly floriferous.
- X **OPHELIA**—Salmon flesh, shaded rose and yellow, of perfect shape. Growth vigorous.
- X **ORANGE NASSAU**—Colour deep orange, reverse of petals clear yellow, very sweet perfume and fine glossy foliage. Highly recommended.
- PATRICK ANDERSON**—Perfectly formed high centre bud, opening to a large beautiful flower of deep rose pink. Growth vigorous and upright with dark bronze green foliage. Blooms full exhibition size. Highly recommended.
- PENELOPE**—Lower half of the flowers reddish crimson, white centre with a deep red flush on the lower side of the petals.
- PHOEBE**—Colour: creamy white, slightly deeper in the centre, and occasionally almost pure white flowers; recommended.
- PICTURE**—Clear rose pink petals. Very fine shape and free flowering. Tea scent; highly recommended.
- PINK DAWN**—Veined rose pink of vigorous growth and attractive foliage. Good for exhibition.
- POINSETTIA**—Long pointed buds opening to large double shapely flowers of bright scarlet. The foliage is glossy green produced on vigorous shoots. Slight fragrance.

BUSH ROSES—continued

- PORTADOWN FRAGRANCE**—Colour is brilliant orange salmon-pink. The habit of growth is vigorous; highly scented.
- PRESIDENT HOOVER**—Bud large, long, pointed. Flower very lasting, moderately fragrant (spicy). Outer petals claret red flushed crimson; inner petals deep salmon flush. Highly recommended.
- QUEEN ASTRID**—Buds Persian yellow, opening to flowers of reddish apricot and bronze. Flowers large, full and fragrant. Recommended.
- QUEENSLAND BEAUTY**—A pink sport of Golden Dawn. Colour: a deep rose pink in the bud stage, but when opened the inner face of the petals show various shades of flesh pink contrasting with the deeper colour on the outside of the petals. Light tea scent.
- RED RADIANCE**—Identical, in every way but one, with the parent variety. The colour is a cerise red which is unexcelled for night decoration.

- REV. F. PAGE ROBERTS**—Large, double, very beautiful blooms with inner face of soft buff and reverse of rich salmon, shaded carmine and yellow. Fruit scent; recommended.

- SWEETNESS**—Apricot on a light buttercup yellow ground, washed and shaded light rosy cerise, with a deep amber base. For sheer beauty and quality it is unequalled, and must appeal to all connoisseurs.
- TALISMAN**—Variable colour, but very beautiful. Deep coppery red which changes to pink and gold as the bloom ages. The blooms are semi-double and open into charming decorative flowers in the most unusual shades. Sweet perfume. Highly recommended.
- TEXAS GOLD**—Yellow sport of President H. Hoover. Similar to Hoover as to growth, but colour is a strong yellow tinged with pink.
